



Lead & Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR) DPH LCRR Final Material Inventory Template

The Connecticut Department of Public Health's (DPH) final version of the LCRR Material Inventory Template is now available.

Pursuant to [EHDW Circular Letter #2023-33](#), public water systems must use and submit the prescribed material inventory template for compliance. Under the LCRR, all community and non-transient community public water systems must develop a lead service line inventory that identifies materials used in the construction and repair of all service lines connected to the distribution system.

The initial inventory must be submitted to the DPH Drinking Water Section by October 16, 2024.

Open Space & Watershed Land Acquisition Grant Program Accepting Applications

DEEP is now accepting applications for the 26th competitive grant round of the Open Space and Watershed Land Acquisition Grant Program (OSWA). The program provides grants to water companies to acquire land to be classified and protected as Class I or Class II water supply watershed lands. The program also assists municipalities and nonprofit land conservation organizations in acquiring land for open space protection.

Awards are granted to projects that offer the highest conservation and recreational value and that leverage the greatest percentage of private and municipal funding.

Application materials must be submitted to DEEP no later than October 2, 2023. Yellow Book appraisals and appraisal reviews can be submitted by no later than November 2, 2023. For more information, including applications, visit DEEP's [website](#).
